Boopside

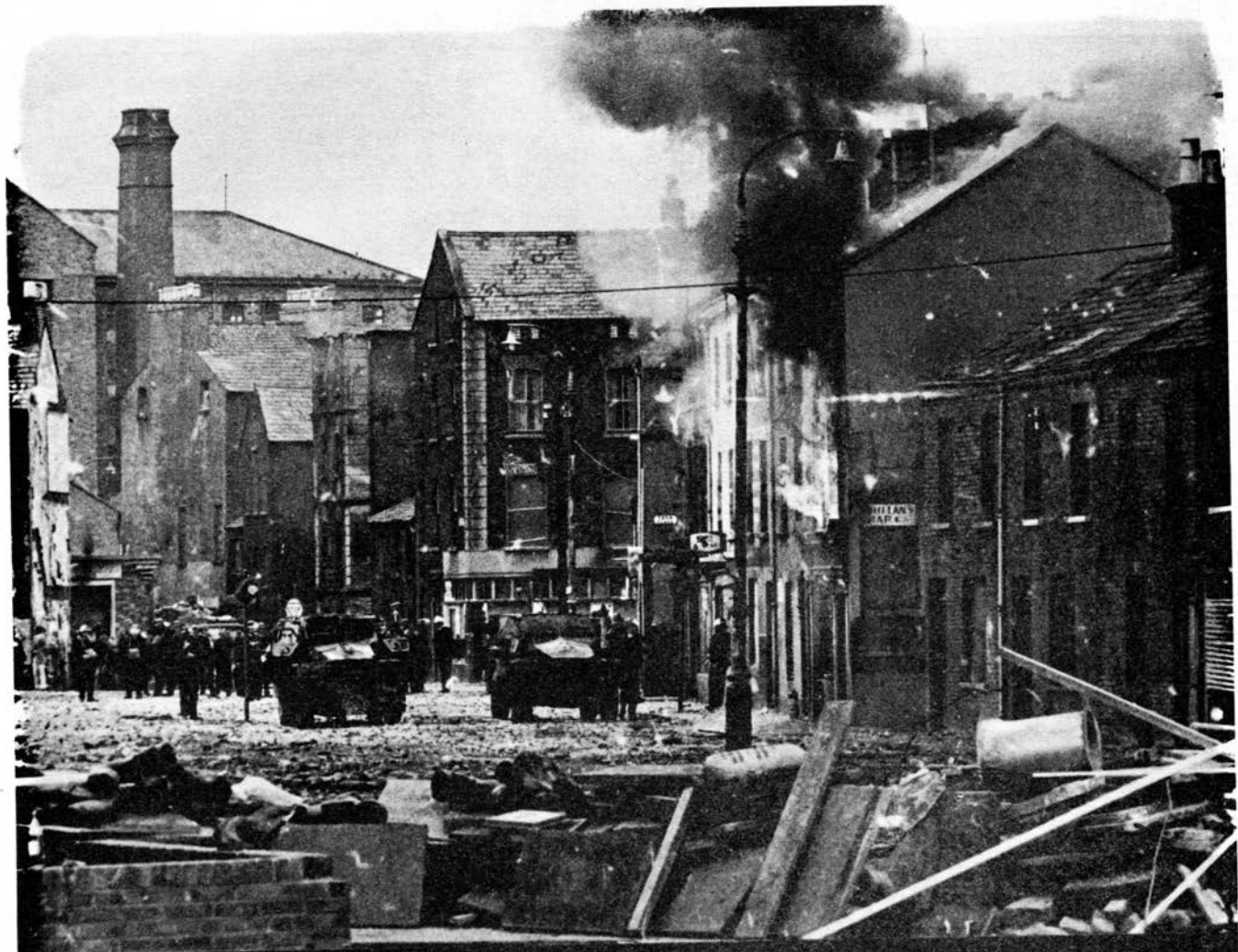

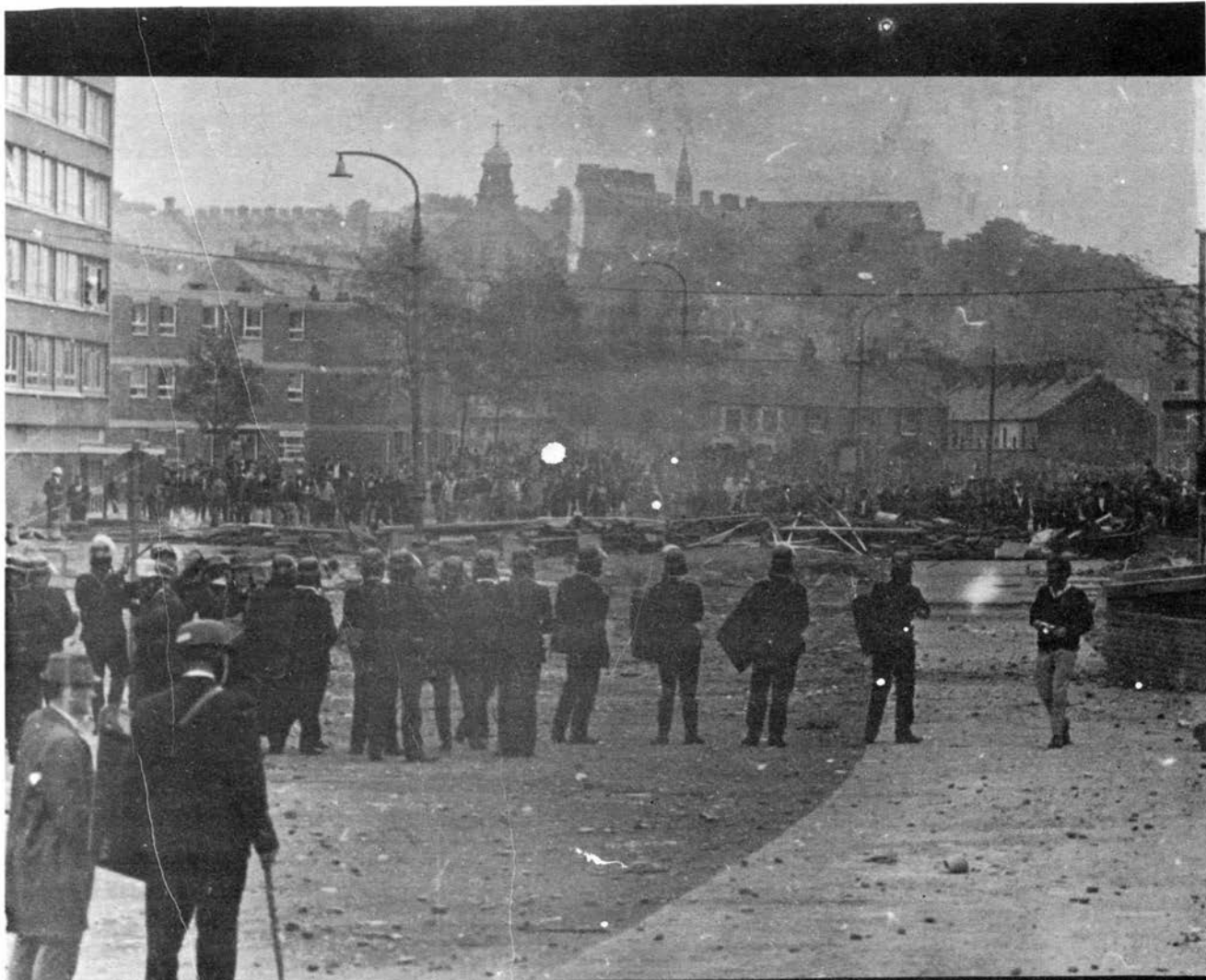

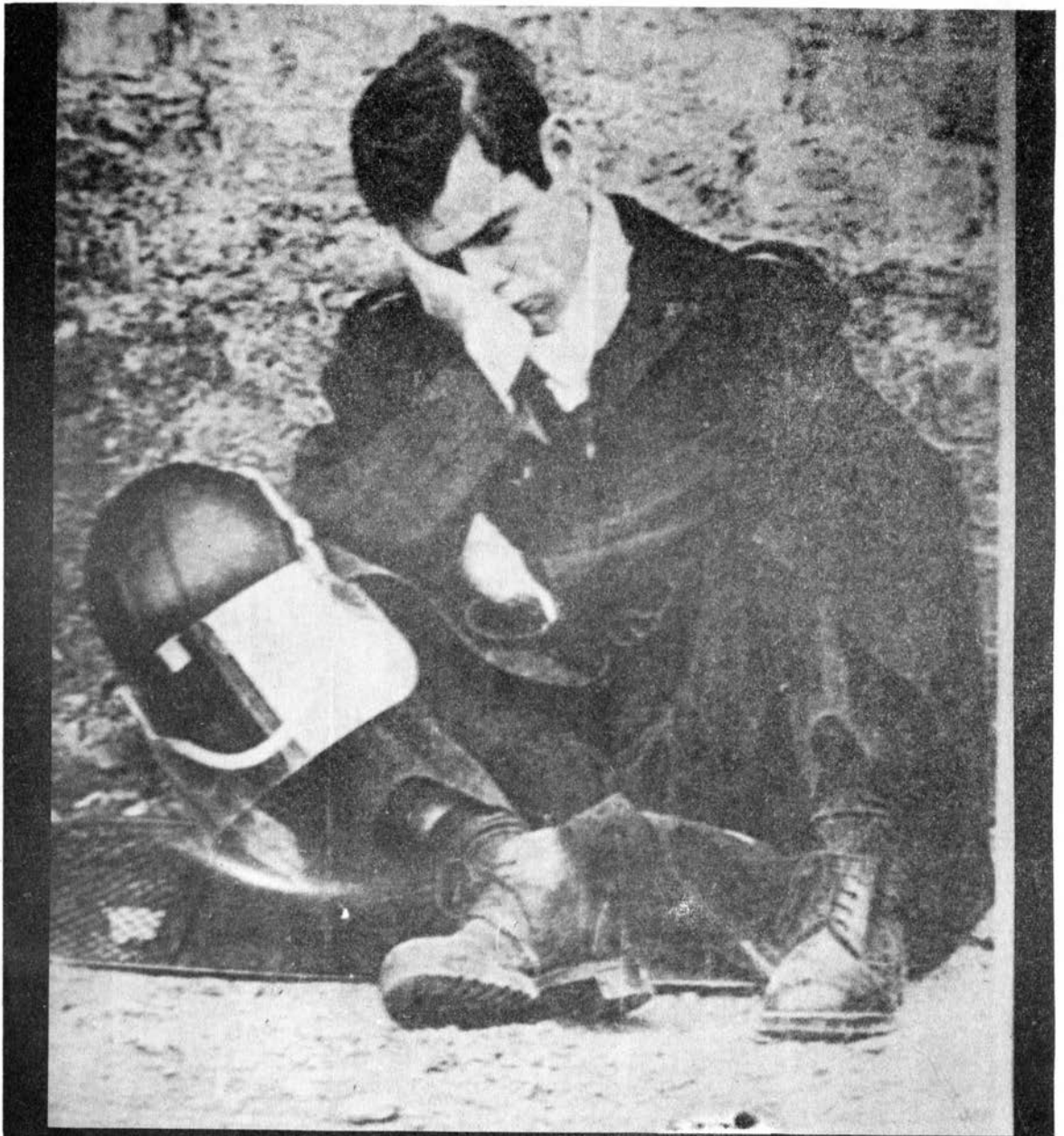

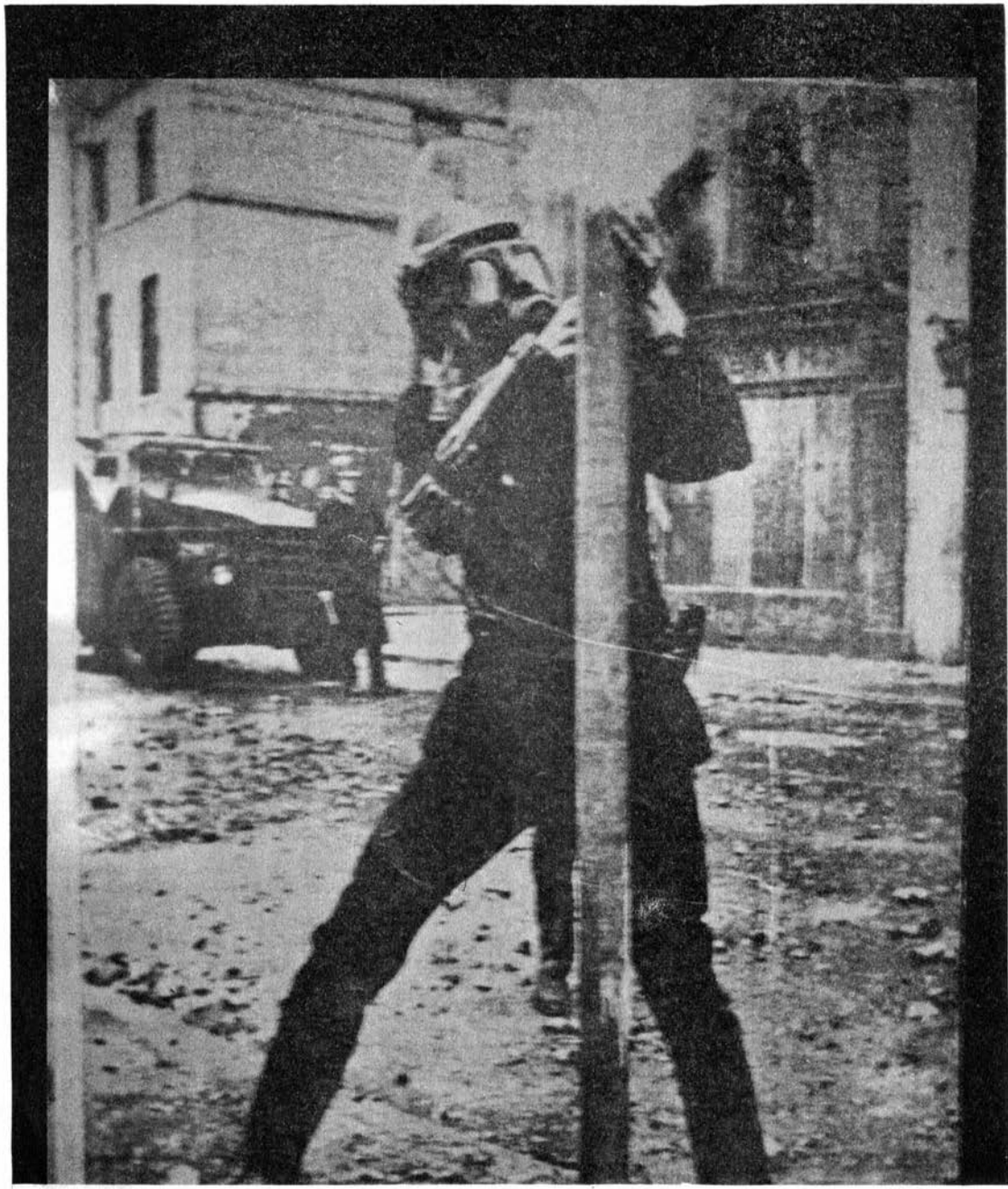

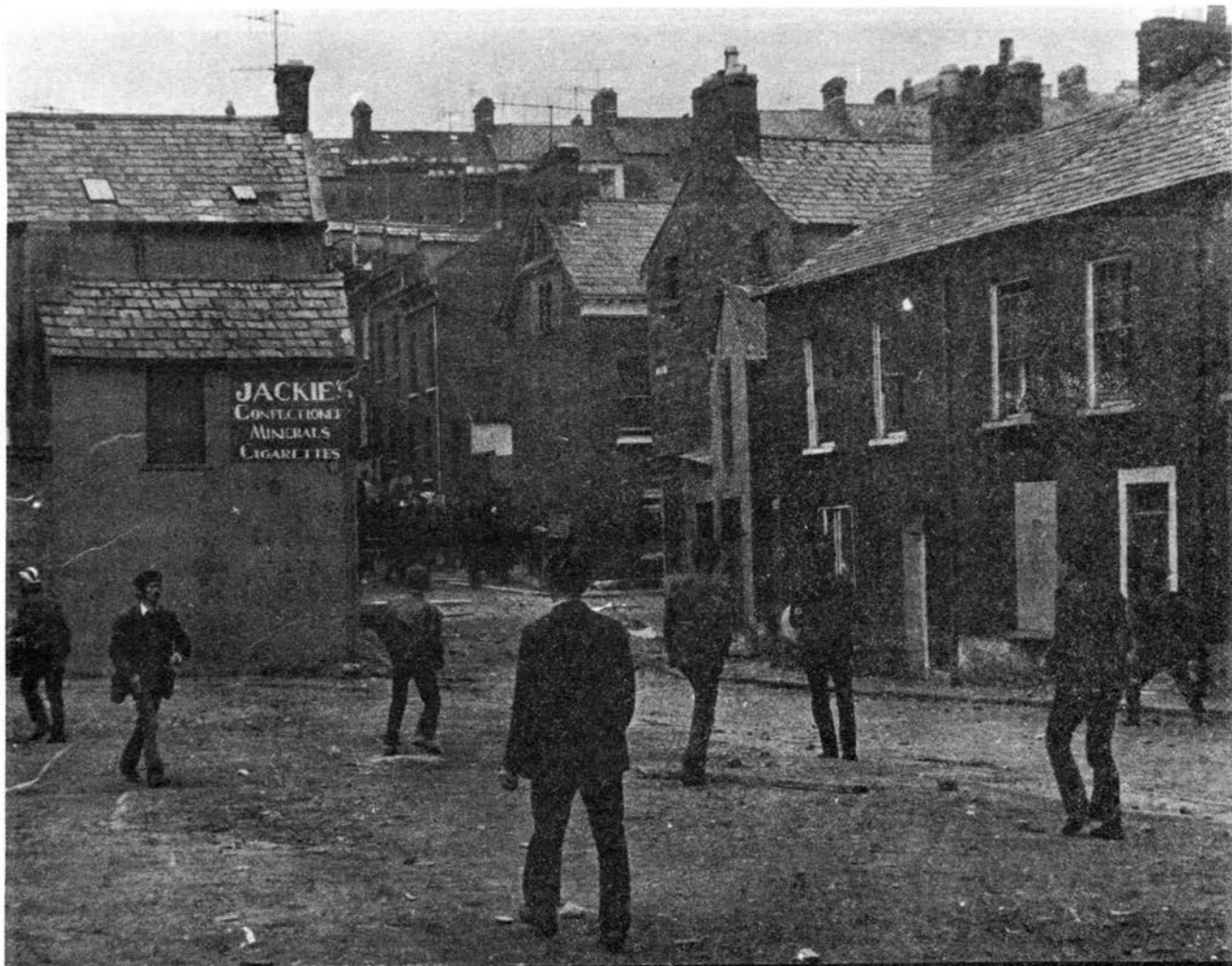

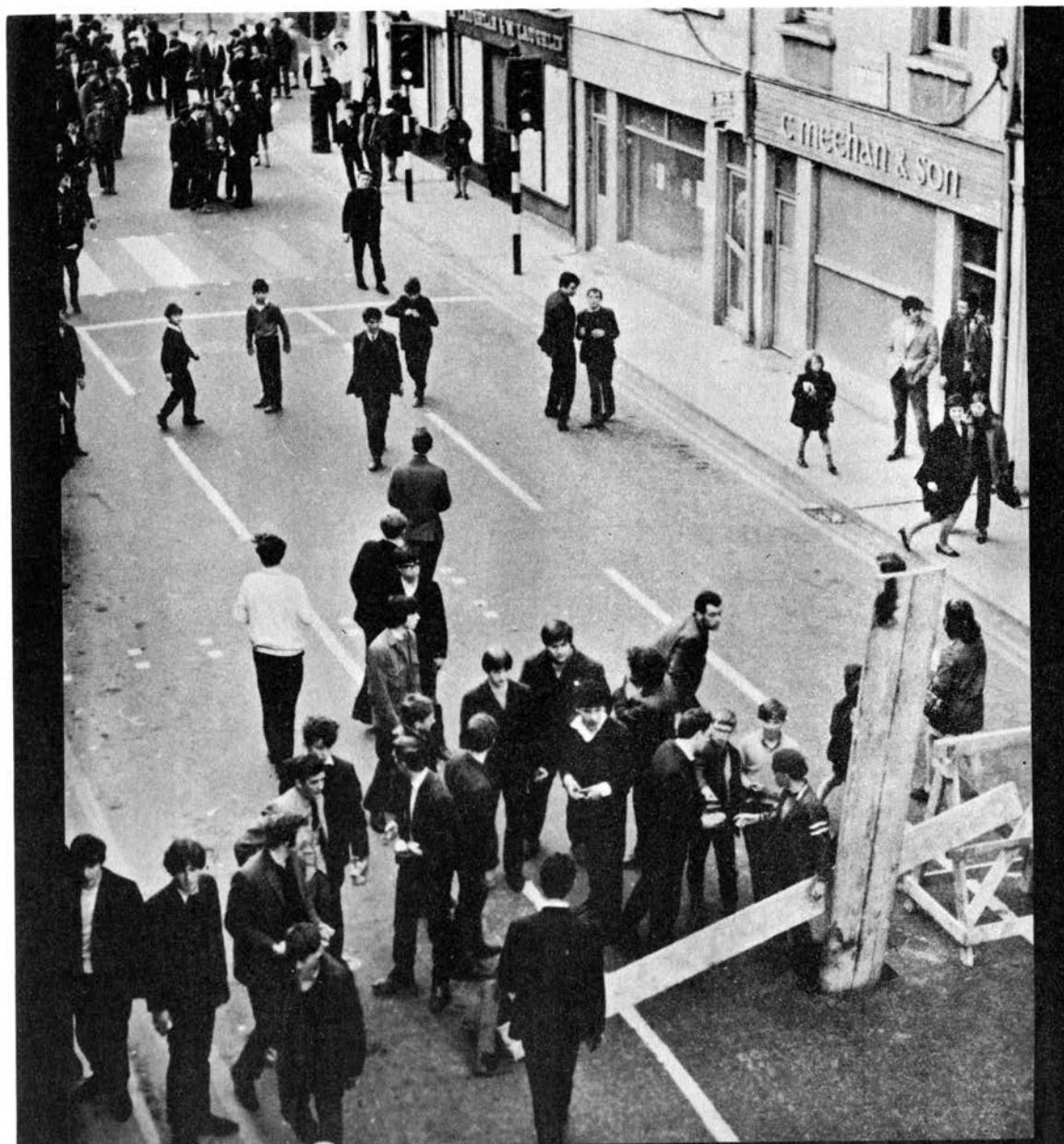

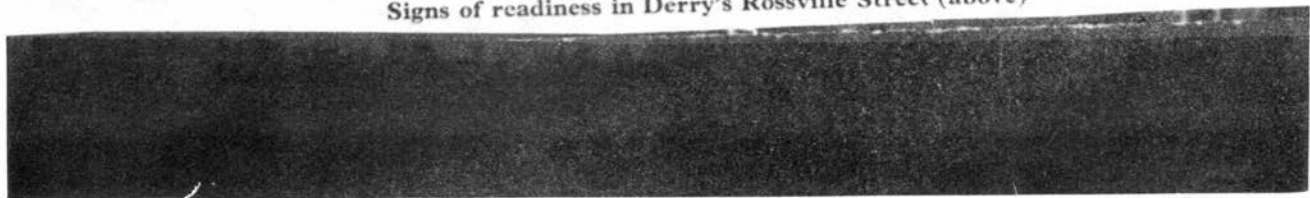
