Thursday, 21 June 2007: A Day of Private Reflection

A Day of Private Reflection: A Day for personal and private reflection on the conflict in and about Northern Ireland. A Day to acknowledge the deep hurt and pain caused by the conflict, to reflect on our own attitudes, on what more we might have done or might still do, and to make a personal commitment that such loss should never be allowed to happen again.

Healing Through Remembering is inviting people from Northern Ireland, Great Britain, Republic of Ireland and further afield to reflect, individually and privately, upon the conflict in and about Northern Ireland. It provides a voluntary opportunity for everyone to begin to both remember the past and to look to a better future.

On 4 October 2006 Healing Through Remembering and its Day of Reflection Sub Group launched a proposal for an initial Day of Private Reflection to be held on 21 June 2007 at a conference in Armagh and invited feedback.

A number of responses to the proposal were received and carefully considered by the Day of Reflection Sub Group. Following this consideration, we believe there is merit and benefit in proceeding with an initial Day of Private Reflection on 21 June 2007.

The Day of Private Reflection is offered as an inclusive and positive event that emphasises a commitment to a peaceful new society. We believe that this initial Day of Private Reflection could provide a way of enabling us to
