Blair to deal with collusion says Adams

Prime Minister Tony Blair will try to deal with the issue of security force collusion with loyalist terror gangs in Northern Ireland, Gerry Adams has said.

The Sinn Fein leader was speaking after a meeting with the Prime Minister in Downing Street in the wake of last week`s devastating report from Northern Ireland`s Police Ombudsman Nuala O`Loan into collusion in North Belfast.

He said the Prime Minister stressed his belief that it was unacceptable for Special Branch officers to allow their loyalist informers to carry out murder.

"The jury is still out as to whether the British Government is going to get to grips with this issue," the West Belfast MP observed.

"Mr Blair did seek to persuade us that they are dealing with this.

"He said it was unacceptable and he intends to ensure it never, ever happens again."

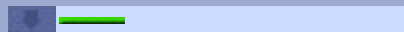
