McCartney trial: row was a "storm in a teacup"

The man accused of murdering Robert McCartney told police the row in Magennis` bar was "a storm in a teacup" which was "blown very, very badly out of proportion."

Belfast Crown Court heard excerpts of police interviews with 51-year-old Terence Davison who was arrested following the murder.

Robert McCartney was stabbed on January 30, 2005 following a bar brawl in the May Street pub.

Davison branded the incident which sparked the fight as "juvenile".

The accused was picked out of a identity parade by two witnesses as the man they saw attacking Mr McCartney on the street.

He has consistently denied throughout the interviews that he was involved in the murder.
