Legacy Inquest may call Sir Ronnie

Former RUC Chief Constable Sir Ronnie Flanagan may have to give evidence at an inquest into the death of a former INLA man.

Dermot McShane, who was 35, was struck by an army vehicle during rioting in Little James Street in Derry on July 13, 1996.

He died from multiple injuries at Altnagelvin Hospital.

A jury of five men and four women are examining the death in Bishop's Street Court House. The inquest is heard by coroner Brian Sherrard.

This landmark legal event is the first so-called *legacy inquest* dealing with controversial and contentious deaths from the troubles.

A Lieutenant Colonel from the Army's legal services has already addressed the coroner on issues touching on the disclosure of confidential military records.

It has also emerged that in November 1996 Sir Ronnie Flanagan is alleged to have made remarks about the circumstances surrounding Mr McShane's death.

The coroner said: "Sir Ronnie may be called to give evidence on this matter."


The inquest is expected to last up to 3 weeks.
