A forum of politicians is to call on the British Government to release secret files on the Real IRA suspects behind the Omagh bombing.

Nobody has been convicted for the 1998 attack, the biggest atrocity of the Northern Ireland's Troubles, which killed 29 people.

The issue will be raised by more than a dozen cross-party members of the British-Irish Inter-Parliamentary Body.

Memorial events were held in Omagh in August to mark the 10th anniversary of the attack.
