Event to mark the 20th anniversary of the murder of Pat Finucane

The launch of a series of events to mark the 20th anniversary of the murder of human rights lawyer Pat Finucane will take place today at 3pm at the site of the former Andersonstown barracks at the top of the Falls Road.

A mural highlighting the demand for truth will also be unveiled at the event.

Sinn Féin President and West Belfast MP Gerry Adams will speak at the event along with a member of the Finucane family and Mark Thompson from the Relatives for Justice Victims group.
