O'Dowd welcomes Hamill Inquiry Ruling

Sinn Féin MLA John O'Dowd has welcomed the decision in the High Court calling on British Secretary of State Shaun Woodward to once again re-examine the remit of the Robert Hamill Inquiry.

Mr O'Dowd said:

"The Hamill family in their bid to establish the truth about the murder of Robert have had obstacle after obstacle placed in their way by the British Government. The British policy of concealment and cover-up has been in full swing.
