Mr Rogers' submission of 4 November set out the background to the incident which led to the trial of Acting Corporal Elkington and Marine Callaghan of 45 Commando Royal Marines for the murder of Fergal Caraher in December 1990. Judgement is due to be given on 23 December 1993.

Briefly, on 5 February 1992 both soldiers were charged with: 2.

the murder of Fergal Caraher;

attempted murder of Michael Caraher;

unlawfully and maliciously wounding Michael Caraher with intent to do him grievous bodily harm.

Both Marines pleaded not guilty to the charges.

The Irish Side of the Secretariat will be informed of the 2. decision as soon as details are available.
