MRC OPINION POLL ON "PUBLIC REACTION TO THE POLITICAL AND SECURITY CLIMATE"

- 1. Ministers may be interested to see the main findings of a recent opinion poll conducted by Marketing Research Consultancy Limited. The poll is based on a sample of 1,000 people who were asked questions of current political and security interest. Overall, the survey underscores the dichotomy between Protestant and Catholic opinion in Northern Ireland.
- 2. The main findings of the survey were as follows:
  - i) There would be significant Nationalist opposition to the implementation of suggested security initiatives, such as introducing identity cards, internment, the sealing of the border and the withdrawal of a suspect's right to remain silent. Unionists, on the other hand, would generally welcome any such developments.
  - ii) With the exception of Sinn Fein adherents, there is overwhelming approval for a requirement for all elected representatives in Northern Ireland, to renounce violence publicly. Overall, 84% of those questioned were in favour, including 86% of SDLP supporters.
  - iii) SDLP supporters appear to be the only section of the community who have drawn comfort from the introduction of the Anglo-Irish Agreement. Even middle-ground nationalists tend to believe that the Agreement has achieved little or nothing since its introduction. Supporters of all political parties believe that the security situation has worsened since the signing of the Anglo-Irish Agreement.
