Glor na nGael

I have seen your decision on Glor na nGael and Richard's minute of 3 September. I understand the delicacy of the information on which the decision was based. I also understand how difficult it can be both to verify the accuracy of such information and to balance various factors in coming to a judgement.

It is already clear that the opposition to the decision will become increasingly widespread and damaging to other policies to which the Government attaches considerable importance.

I hope therefore that, as part of the balance which had to be struck, consideration has been given to whether the long-term consequences of this decision - in political and other terms - are likely to be more or less damaging than the continuation of funding would be.

I think it would be helpful to give some urgent thought to how we can mitigate the more damaging effects of this decision while it stands.
