The project is to provide seed capital funding for new start-up businesses in LEDU admissible companies operating in the manufacturing and business services sectors, where seed capital refers to funding for pre-start or new start businesses. In identifying the need for a new Seed Capital Fund we have looked at the current provision of funding for small firms in NI and assessed potential demand for this type of support. Our analysis highlights the fact that availability with regard to financing small businesses and accessibility of small firm finance is a key issue in NI, confirming the need for more accessible small firm finance over and above that provided. In direct response to need the Seed Capital Fund would therefore provide funding of up to £50,000 to be targeted at the following:-

- those groups in disadvantaged areas or which have been disadvantaged as a result of the political situation in NI.
- projects which have difficulty in accessing funding from other sources.
- high tech projects (although not exclusively).

The objectives of the proposed Fund are in keeping with the objectives of the Productive Investment and Industrial Development Sub-Programme of the SSP and are:-

- To create and accelerate investment in NI.
- To improve access to finance for new business starts in disadvantaged areas and for individuals whose circumstances make access to finance difficult.
- To encourage individuals from disadvantaged areas to take forward viable business ideas.
- To provide assistance for new businesses which will ultimately feed into LEDU growth programmes.
- To increase the number of employment opportunities in NI as a whole and in disadvantaged areas in particular.
- To alleviate the labour market difficulties in NI and make an impact on the long term unemployment problems experienced in disadvantaged areas.

Output indicators for the Seed Capital Fund are:-

- Number and value of approved loans drawn down.
- Performance of enterprises after they have received assistance eg. whether they move onto LEDU growth programmes.
- Number of businesses selling in export markets.
- Number of jobs sustained or new jobs created as a direct result of the assistance.
- Proportion of assisted projects in deprived areas.

The overall impact of the Seed Capital Fund will be to increase the level of investment in the NI economy and particularly in deprived areas. This should have a positive impact on the number of jobs sustained and created which will ultimately enhance the economic and social fabric of local communities throughout NI.

The project will directly result in the development of new sustainable businesses thereby contributing to the creation and safe guarding of jobs and is to target disadvantaged areas in particular. It will help to promote reconciliation by stimulating private sector investment leading to sustainable employment and development through stimulating new business starts in disadvantaged areas.

There are a range of funding schemes in NI currently available for pre-start and new start-up businesses including the Business Enterprise Loan Fund, LEDU's Regional Loan Fund, NIIP Small Business Venture Fund and PYBT. The proposed Seed Capital Fund will complement these activities by providing accessible funding of up to £50,000 for viable projects which have difficulty in accessing funds from other sources and which represent disadvantaged areas or groups.

The project is to be administered through four channels with a focused level of usage under

1. Local Enterprise Fund - 6 LEAs processing approximately 200 loans in total each one: per year.

- 2. ORTUS Fund approximately 15 referrals per quarter ie. 60 per year.
- 3. NIIP Fund relatively small number of high tech, high growth potential.
- 4. Peer Group Lending approximately 200 small, short term loans per year.

The project will target groups from disadvantaged areas or which have been disadvantaged as a result of the political situation in Northern Ireland.
