- calls for the fundamental rights of freedom of assembly and procession to be upheld and for Article 7 of the Public Order (Northern Ireland)
  Order 1987 to be enforced;

- recognises the basic flaw in the legislation which permits the use or threat of violence to dictate whether a lawful parade proceeds or not;
- condemns the interference of the Dublin Government in the internal affairs of Northern Ireland which is provocative and which serves to escalate tension in the community.
- 4. Professor Antony Alcock to propose the following motion:-

This Forum warmly welcomes the European Union's 1995 5 year special programme for peace and reconciliation of 300 million ECU (£240 million), and in particular the targeting of disadvantaged groups for financial assistance, and urges the Union, despite the shortcomings perceived in the first 3 years of operations, to continue to make funds available in the final 2 years in order for the programme to be carried to a successful conclusion.
