You were kind enough to tell me recently of your Government's plans to make a bid to host the World Summer Games of the Special Olympics in Ireland in 2003.

There is, as you know, a significant Northern Ireland component to "Special Olympics Ireland". And I have heard many good things about their work, in terms of the contribution it has been making to promoting social inclusion, and the development of North/South friendship and understanding. You may recall, for example, last year's "Special Olympics Torch Run", in which the Royal Ulster Constabulary and the Garda Siochana collaborated in an impressive fund-raising effort for "Special Olympics".
