## TRANSITION PROGRAMME - SEMINAR/WORKSHOP SERIES NORTH/SOUTH CO-OPERATION

1. Further to our telephone conversation this afternoon I am writing to seek your assistance in putting me in contact with a representative on the Irish Side who might take responsibility for designing a seminar/workshop on North/South Co-Operation.

#### **Background**

- 2. The Seminar will be one of a series of such events that the Secretary of State is keen to offer to newly-elected Assembly members between July-November 1998. She is convinced that the North/South seminars (which could be repeated as required) are pivotal to the Programme and is anxious that the Irish, in collaboration with colleagues in the North, play a full part in their design and delivery.
- 3. The Programme is made up of 3 complementary components:
  - Seminar/Workshop series
  - International Programme
  - Supplementary Programme

An outline schedule for the Programme, with dates for when the events might run, is attached.

I would be grateful if you could give this matter your urgent attention. I am being pressed to have preliminary seminar designs by the end of June. I need to speak as soon as possible to someone who will either take responsibility for the North/South element of the Programme or who can help me make contact with others who will. I am available to meet at very short notice and I look forward to hearing from you.
