THE CENOTAPH

When I wrote to you on 28 August, in response to your letter of 31 July, I agreed that we should defer a decision on whether Sinn Fein should be invited to be represented at the Cenotaph ceremony until the second week in September. I told you however that, irrespective of the outcome of the current negotiations I would have deep misgivings about including Sinn Fein.

I have to say that my misgivings are as strong as ever. The fact that Sinn Fein had been invited to the ceremony - whether or not they accepted the invitation would be bound to cause distress to many of the people there, and particularly of course to those who had lost relatives and friends in Northern Ireland. I very much hope that there will be a time when we can properly include Sinn Fein in this and other occasions; but I do not think that time has yet come. I propose therefore, unless I hear from you by Friday 19 September, to send out invitations on the basis set out in my minute of 26 July to the Prime Minister.

I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister, Donald Dewar and Ron Davies.
