#### THE LEGISLATIVE TASK

This week-long programme is designed to provide legislators from the Northern Ireland Assembly with tools and ideas that will help them carry out their legislative task by using United States legislators as a model. The week-long programme combines discussions with academic experts on legislative behaviour, federalism, and legislative executive relations and policy analysis with field visits to legislative offices and other relevant working governmental organisations. Participants will meet with State Senators, State Representatives, City Councillors and their staff to discuss best practices, public private partnerships and discuss successful working models for delivering good government. Specific topics of analysis will include legislative oversight and accountability; information technology and communications; and intergovernmental relations. Extensive use will be made of case studies and simulations in order to give legislators the opportunity to participate actively in working through real problems of governance.
